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Admission Procedures for Social Work at CUAA

Transfer Students cannot enroll into Upper Division social work courses or begin a field placement until they have completed the application process for Upper Division Social Work Status. Students must be officially accepted by the Director of the Social Work Program. Students need to apply for Upper Division Status along with their transfer paperwork during the spring semester of their Sophomore year and begin their Upper Division SW Foundation Courses in the fall of their junior year. Prior to Upper Division Status, students are must take two introductory courses, SW 225 (Social Work and Social Welfare) and SW 235 (Introduction to Child Welfare) during freshman or sophomore years. SW 225 will be transferred, so SW 235 must be taken fall of Junior year at latest, with permission. Upper Division Social Work Foundation courses are offered in a sequence which begins in the fall of the student's junior year.

Transfer Students may be accepted into Upper Division Status, if they have completed the above requirements or received approval from the Dir. of the Social Work Program. These students will need to review their transfer core curriculum credits with the admissions counselor and Registrar's Office. Any transfer credits related to the social work major and social science minor must be reviewed by the Director of the Social Work Program.

To maintain a good standing, a student must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2 .5 and a minimum GPA of 2 .75 in social work classes. A student may repeat a course one time.

The process for admission to Upper Division Status:

- Complete transfer agreements
- Receive approval of transfer from Dir. of Social Work Program
- Register for SW235 in fall of Junior Year (first semester at CUAA)
- Complete an application for acceptance into Upper Division
- Completion of Application for Admission Form
- Completion of an Upper Division Narrative (self-study)
- Interview with Dir. of the Social Work Program or social work

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Additional Information:

- 1. Each institution will determine the satisfaction for their individual program and degree requirements. For the purpose of this articulation agreement, both institutions agree to accept transferable courses from each other and from other institutions. WCC courses indicated with a# are required for CUAA's Social Work program. Substitutions for these courses must be approved by the CUAA program director.
- 2. Only courses with a grade of "C-" or better (1.6667 on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer at CUAA.
- 3. Students must satisfy all admission requirements at the time of application for admission to CUAA, including submitting transcripts from all previously attended colleges. WCC students will receive equal consideration with all other students for course registration and financial aid.
- 4. A minimum of 120 credit hours completed in residence or accepted in transfer (70 max) for graduation.
- 5. Students must apply to the Social Work Program for Upper Division Status during the second semester of their sophomore year. To maintain a good standing, a student must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2 .5 and a minimum GPA of 2 .75 in social work classes. They must also complete an application and self-study.
